2026 New Century Competition- Percussion

1. <u>Competition Procedures</u>

- 1.1.1.1. Complete the online application available at https://www.nanm.org/scholarship.
- 1.2 Choose to perform one of the following instruments: timpani, snare drum, marimba, or glockenspiel.
- 1.3 The only requirement for repertoire is adherence to the categories listed. Commercially published, self-published, and manuscript music are equally permissible.
 - 1.3.1.1 Category 1 One piece by a Black composer from the 20th Century.
 - 1.3.1.2 Category 2 One piece by a Black composer from the 21st Century.
 - 1.3.1.3 Category 3- One piece composed by any percussion composer during any period.
 - 1.3.1.4 At least one work must be memorized.
 - 1.3.1.5 At least one piece must be unaccompanied, 2-5-minute duration.
 - **1.4** Submit government-issued photo identification (e.g., driver's license, passport) and a non-refundable \$50 application fee.
 - 1.5 The application, photo identification, and application fee are due by 11:59 pm Central Standard Time on January 5, 2026.
 - **1.6** Incomplete applications are not accepted. Any missing element of 1.4 or 1.5 will disqualify an applicant.

2 Contestant Rules

2.3 Eligibility

- **2.3.1.1** The age limit is **18 to 30** years old between August 1, 2025, and July 31, 2026. Applicants must upload their valid State or Federal ID in the secure, encrypted application form.
- **2.3.1.2** A first-place winner at the national level is ineligible to compete during the next competition for the same instrument category.
- **2.3.1.3** Full-time, public or private-school music teachers and college faculty as defined in academia (e.g. lecturers, adjunct, tenure-track, tenured professors) are ineligible to compete.

2.1.1.4 Contestants who, before the commencement of the competition or at any time during the competition, are under an exclusive contract with a management or recording agency are ineligible to compete.

2.4 Competition

- **2.4.1.1** Contestants must supply the National Scholarship Chair with three legal copies of each work to be performed.
- **2.4.1.2** This is to ensure there is no copyright infringement.
- **2.4.1.3** If a photocopy is used, there must be written proof from the publisher/distributor/copyright holder granting permission to photocopy, including self-published and manuscript music.
- **2.4.1.4** Copies should be clean (no markings), double-sided, and placed in separate binders or digital folders.
- **2.4.1.5** There will be one set for each adjudicator.
- **2.4.1.6** It is the responsibility of the contestant to ensure that all pages are present.
- **2.4.1.7** Exceptions are made for the use of multiple original copies.
- **2.4.1.8** Legal digital copies and folders are acceptable.
- **2.4.1.9** Competition chairs determine the timeline for submitting these copies/folders. The timeline must be communicated to the contestant(s) at least one week in advance.
- **2.4.1.10** A contestant's actual performance time, including transitions between pieces, must not exceed 30 minutes.
- **2.4.1.11** Attire for the national competition is formal, either a formal gown or suit.

3 Competition Procedures

3.3 Logistics

- **3.3.1.1** Applicants are to submit a digital video file of a live recording of their competition repertoire. It is recommended that the applicant uses the best equipment available and that recordings are of "high quality".
- **3.3.1.2** The video should be a continuous unedited view of the performer's pedagogical skills. All submissions should not exceed 30 minutes of performance repertoire.
- **3.3.1.3** The video must be submitted to the National Scholarship Chair by 11:50 pm (EST) on **March 15, 2026.** No late submissions will be accepted.

3.2 Submission Review

- 3.2.1 All submissions will be reviewed and adjudicated by a National Committee of professional percussionists.
- 3.2.2 The National Percussion Sub-Committee will be representative of the five regions of the National Association. These members will be selected by the Regional Scholarship Chairs.
- 3.2.3 The National Percussion Sub-Committee will recommend applicants to perform at the National Convention.

3,3 Results

- 3.3.1 The National Competition Chair will notify the applicants of the results by April 15, 2026.
- 3.3.2 The NANM Board will provide two nights stay for each contestant. Contestants must cover travel expenses.

3.4 Adjudicators

- **3.3.1.4** Three professional percussionists will be invited to serve as adjudicators during the national competition.
- **3.3.1.5** The adjudicators will be selected by the National Scholarship Committee.

3.5 Rules for Adjudicators and Competition Chairpersons

- **3.3.2** Adjudicator Rules and Procedures
 - **3.3.2.1** Using the prepared Adjudicator Scoring Sheet, each contestant will be scored using a 30-Point system. The raw data for each adjudicator will be used to determine contestant placements.
 - **3.3.2.2** Adjudicators are to write comments about each performance on the adjudication form. Comments should be made to help the contestant and not be punitive.
 - **3.3.2.3** Adjudicators must sign their name on their adjudication form.
 - **3.3.2.4** Adjudicators will convene following the performance of the last contestant to review the scores and discuss the results.
 - **3.3.2.5** In the case of a tie vote, the adjudicators must discuss then make the final decision.
- **3.3.3** Only the approved adjudication form may be used in its unaltered form.

3.6 Awards

- 3.6.1 The winner is announced following the adjudicator deliberation session.
- 3.6.2 The first-place winner will receive an award of \$7,000.00.
- 3.6.3 The second-place winner will receive an award of \$3,500.00
